





#### **2024 Annual Meeting Survey Summary**

More than 130 patient navigation leaders from across the US convened in Washington, D.C., for the ACS National Navigation Roundtable (ACS NNRT) Annual Meeting September 18 - 20. Attendees shared ideas and strategies for achieving ACS NNRT's five-year AIM (2021-2026): supporting the creation of a sustainable model for oncology patient navigation to achieve health equity across the cancer continuum. A post-survey had 38 responses with highlights shared here.

95% of respondents agree the annual meeting enabled them to create partnerships with other member organizations.


#### **Program Outcomes**
