

#### **Cancer Moonshot highlight:**

Andrea (Andi) Dwyer, (left) Chair of the American Cancer Society National Navigation Roundtable (ACS NNRT) of the Colorado Cancer Screening Program at the University of Colorado Cancer Center and Monica Dean (right) of The Academy of Oncology Nurse & Patient Navigators (AONN+) attended the Biden Administration Cancer Moonshot Colorectal Cancer Forum in March 2023, with about 50 other cancer leaders and advocates. Andi and Monica were chosen as attendees based on the importance of patient navigation and community health work as a sustainable



strategy to achieve health equity and urging the Biden administration to prioritize patient navigation and community health work within the Moonshot. Also, Andi Dwyer attended a working lunch with Fight Colorectal Cancer. This meeting provided the opportunity to create a framework to further the work between cancer prevention and control with preventive cancer screening navigation.
